- Strong Bonds



The Chaplain's Cornerstones

- United States Constitution, Amendment 1
 "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof."
- Your Chaplain Exists to Facilitate the Service Member's Free Exercise of Religion
- Ecclesiastical Endorsement- Endorser Training requirements should be supported- See LCC's Command Master Religious Plan (CMRP)

The Chaplain's Cornerstones

 Massachusetts Constitution Part the Frist Article II It is the right as well as the duty of all men in society, publicly, and at stated seasons to worship the Supreme Being, the great Creator and Preserver of the universe. And no subject shall be hurt, molested, or restrained, in his person, liberty, or estate, for worshipping God in the manner and season most agreeable to the dictates of his own conscience; or for his religious profession or sentiments; provided he doth not disturb the public peace, or obstruct others in their religious worship.

The Chaplain's Cornerstones

U.S. Code 3547-Section 3547


(a) Each chaplain shall, when practicable, hold appropriate religious services at least once on each Sunday for the command to which he is assigned, and shall perform appropriate religious burial services for members of the Army who die while in that command. (b) Each commanding officer shall furnish facilities, including necessary transportation, to any chaplain assigned to his command, to assist the chaplain in performing his duties.

Intermediate Rater


"There will be a supervisory chaplain in the rating chain when possible. For example a brigade chaplain, as the supervisory chaplain, would be the intermediate rater for a battalion chaplain. In the absence of a supervisory chaplain, a senior chaplain familiar with the rated chaplain's performance should be designated as the intermediate rater."


Promotion Results Major (PZ)



Promotion Results Lieutenant Colonel




Promotion Results Colonel (PZ)


CPT ACC VS. CH CPT Experience by Weeks

Chaplain as Special Staff Officer

- Provides the commander with pastoral care, personal counseling, advice, and privileged communications
- Develops and implements the commander's religious support program
- Coordinates religious support with unit ministry teams of higher and adjacent headquarters, other Services, and multinational forces
- Helps the commander ensure all Soldiers have the opportunity to exercise their religion
- Performs or provides religious rites, sacraments, ordnances, services, and pastoral care and counseling to nurture the living, care for casualties, and honor the dead
- Provides religious support to the command and community, including confined or hospitalized personnel, enemy prisoners of war, civilian detainees, and refugees
- Provides liaison with indigenous religious leaders
- Trains, equips, and supports subordinate chaplains and chaplain assistants



- Describe Staff Relationships and Responsibilities
- Participate in MDMP
- Conduct a Running Estimate
- Present a Military Briefing
- Develop Staff Studies and Decision Papers
- Analyze Plans and Orders
- Conduct Religious Support Planning, Preparation, Coordination and Execution
